

Interactive Textbook for Practicum in Early Childhood Education

Greetings! This message is being sent by the ASCCC Open Educational Resources (OER) Initiative on behalf of a faculty member who is seeking colleagues to collaborate on OER for Practicum in Early Childhood Education. As the OERI requires that funded projects involve collaborators from at least three California Community College districts, we are assisting potential applicants who need collaborators. The need is described as follows:

We are in the process of writing a proposal for creating an Open Educational Resources (OER) textbook for <a href="Practicum">Practicum in Early Childhood Education (C-ID ECE 210)</a>/CAP Practicum. This course is required for students to advance in their studies and to obtain their degree and/or certificate, to transfer to University, and/or to apply for the Teacher State Permit Level or higher. This textbook would be made accessible to students at no cost and focus on the following:

Developmentally Appropriate Practices (DAP) Child-Initiated/Emergent

Curriculum (Cycle of Inquiry) High-Quality in ECE Nature-Based Social

Constructivist Approach (i.e., Reggio Inspired Principles of Learning). It would also contain embedded assignments and resources that reflect the Universal Design for Learning (UDL) framework as well as Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Anti-Racism (IDEA). The aim of this project would be for the OER textbook to be adopted in a Community College setting where the Practicum class is included in the program. We are looking for California Community College collaborators that would support this project by one of the following:

- Writing, reviewing and/or revising the writing phases of the textbook.
- Helping with the design of the embedded assignments.
- Piloting it in your course once published, possibly by the Spring/Summer of 2023.
