Creative Commons defines OER as teaching, learning, and research materials that are either:

- (a) in the public domain or
 - (b) licensed in a manner that provides everyone with free and perpetual permission to engage in the 5R activities.
- textbook, videos, images, articles, assignments

The 5R Permissions of OER

Make and own copies

Reuse

Use in a wide range of ways

Revise

Adapt, modify, and improve

Remix

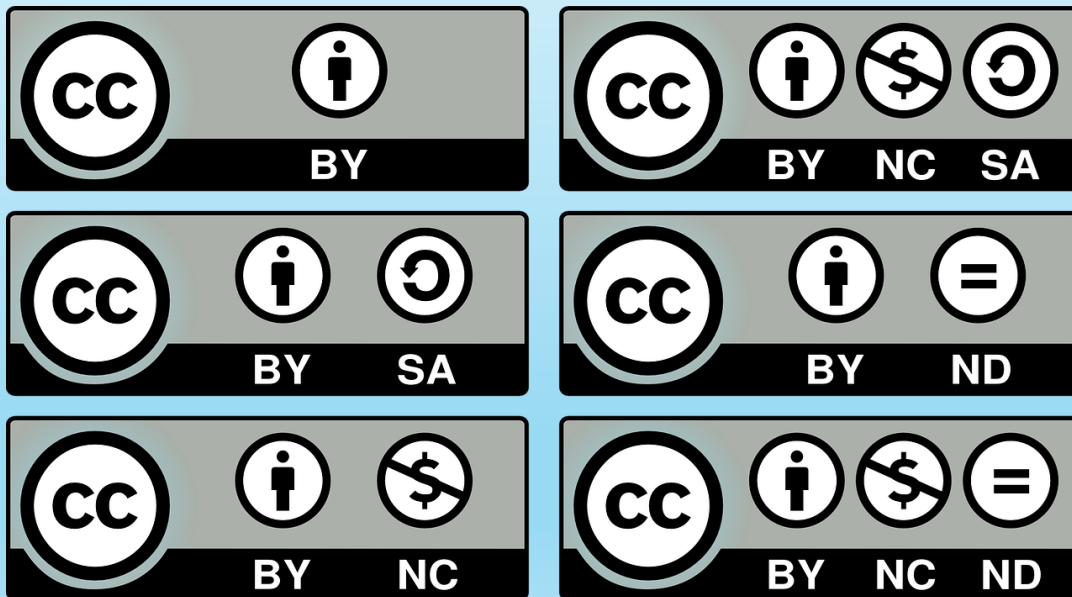
Combine two or more
