As the OERI requires that funded projects involve collaborators from at least three California Community College districts who would use the proposed resource or resources, we are assisting potential applicants who need collaborators. The need is described as follows:

Introduction to Real Estate Careers

Currently, there is no comprehensive textbook for the course "Introduction to Real Estate Careers". This is a vocational / CTE course designed to prepare students for job opportunities.

Experience required: currently teach or have taught college-level real estate courses. The basic structure, outline, topics, rough draft of content, and some quiz questions have already been written. To complete this online textbook, your tasks would include one or more of the following: researching scholarly resources, documenting topics, writing or expanding content, editing content, writing/submitting reports, and/or completing administrative forms. Collaborative meetings will be held regularly as all authors work together in a collegial manner. Regular reports on progress will be required. Must be committed to finishing this project on time.
