What are Open Educational Resources?

Creative Commons defines OER as teaching, learning, and research materials that are either (a) in the public domain or (b) licensed in a manner that provides everyone with free and perpetual permission to engage in the 5R activities.

The 5R Permissions of Open

Retain Make and own copies

Reuse Use in a wide range of ways

Revise Adapt, modify, and improve

Remix Combine two or more

Redistribute Share with others

OER and ES Findings (Spring 2023)

The <u>LibreTexts bookshelf for "Ethnic Studies"</u> contains material that is from outside disciplines on topics related to race / ethnicity.

Two projects have been funded by the ASCCC OERI to create OER books on *Introduction to Ethnic Studies* and *New Directions in Chicanx and Latinx Studies*.

There are no appropriate open access textbooks for African American Studies, Native American Studies, or Asian American Studies.

OER and ES Recommendations (Spring 2023)

- Recommendation #1: Raise awareness about new and forthcoming
 OER materials in Ethnic Studies to generate awareness, engagement,
 and excitement about OER among discipline faculty.
- Recommendation #2: Convene discipline faculty to collaborate on the creation of OER materials.
- Recommendation #3: Faculty to apply for and receive funding from the ASCCC OERI to create introductory textbook materials for Introduction to African American Studies, Introduction to Native American Studies, and Introduction to Asian American Studies.

ASCCC OERI Request for Proposals (RFP) V

- RFP V due February 22, 2023
 - Awards announced by Friday, March 10, 2023
 - Collaboration Requirement: collaboration across at least three districts is required
 - Equity Requirement: IDEA principles and/or culturally responsive pedagogy.
 - Statewide Course Category: courses that fulfill the recently implemented ethnic studies general education requirement (i.e., CSU GE Area F) and related majors.
