

Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) Acceleration Grant Collaboration Cohort Social Work and Human Services Final Report

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INTRODUCTION

The Social Work and Human Services (SWHS) Collaboration Cohort was the first cohort to conclude its work. This cohort consisted of three colleges working on the SWHS Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T) and two working on other programs. As there are only 3 SWHS courses in the SWHS AA-T and most of these courses were already ZTC, there was little potential for collaboration on SWHS courses. There was only one shared need across the colleges, C-ID SWHS 110, and the course in question is well-served by available open educational resources (OER).

COLLABORATION COHORT PURPOSE

The Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC) Open Educational Resources Initiative (OERI) facilitated the work of the ZTC Acceleration Grant Social Work and Human Services Collaboration Cohort. Although this process was introduced to prevent the duplication of effort, it also provides a means to ensure the awareness of available OER and other sustainable means of achieving ZTC status, share OER development plans, and identify opportunities for collaboration across colleges. At the conclusion of the cohort process, the OERI will provide a report to the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) that will document the work of the cohort, verify the absence of duplicative plans, and/or delineate how duplication will be prevented or minimized.

SOCIAL WORK AND HUMAN SERVICES (SWHS) COLLABORATION COHORT (COHORT) – MEMBER COLLEGES AND ZTC PATHWAYS

An initial analysis of the discipline courses the colleges had in common identified little overlap in the ZTC work planned by the colleges. Unless otherwise specified, the course titles used throughout this document reflect the titles used in the Course Identification Numbering System (C-ID). This cohort benefitted from resource sharing during a meeting on April 23, 2024. Following the meeting, additional information was gathered. As noted, there was one instance where two colleges were working on the same course. The course in question, C-ID SWHS 110 is well-served by OER. One of the colleges was planning to revise an existing OER (RHC) and the other was planning to adopt an OER without modification (Mendocino).

Cohort Participants and Data Collection

The following colleges participated in the Social Work and Human Services (SWHS) Collaboration Cohort:

- Cerro Coso College Human Services Worker CoA (already awarded)
- Madera College SWHS AA-T (already awarded)
- Mendocino College Human Services Paraprofessional AS
- Rio Hondo College SWHS AA-T (already awarded)
- Southwestern College SWHS AA-T (already awarded)

The ASCCC OERI collected course level data for each of the pathways including current ZTC status, adopted resources, and plans to convert a course to ZTC to identify overlap and areas of potential collaboration. Since 3 out of the 5 colleges are converting the SWHS AA-T, the courses were grouped using the Social Work and Human Services TMC to identify commonalities.

Cohort Convening

The Social Work and Human Services Collaboration Cohort convened synchronously via Zoom on April 23. The ASCCC OERI presented the group with the results of the data collection process and asked for clarity where data were missing. In addition, the ASCCC OERI presented available OER for the cohort's consideration.

Findings

Introduction to Social Work and Human Services (C-ID SWHS 110) seems to be well served by OER with 3 out of the 5 colleges currently offering this course as ZTC. Mendocino and Rio Hondo are reviewing available OER for adoption. Mendocino intends to adopt existing materials without remixing and Rio Hondo anticipates adopting

existing OER with minimal modifications. The other 4 colleges have no intention of creation.

Social Work and Humans Services Seminar (C-ID SWHS 120A) and Social Work and Humans Services Fieldwork (C-ID SWHS 120B) are currently ZTC at 4 of the 5 colleges. These courses are commonly taught without a textbook but Cerro Coso, Madera, and Southwestern use OER to supplement the course. Southwestern College also used no-cost non-OER digital materials (e.g., NASW Code of ethics). Mendocino intends to adopt existing materials without remixing.

The other required courses for the SWHS AA-T include:

- Intro to Sociology (C-ID SOCI 110)
- Intro Psychology (C-ID PSYC 110)
- Intro to Statistics (C-ID MATH 110) or Intro to Stats in Soc (C-ID SOCI 125)
- Human Anat with Lab (C-ID BIOL 110B) or Human Phys with Lab (C-ID BIOL 130B) or Human Anat and Phys with Lab (C-ID BIOL 115S), Human Biology or other biology course with articulation
- Micro (C-ID ECON 201) or Macro (C-ID ECON 202)

Each of the 3 colleges converting the SWHS AA-T indicated that all core courses are currently ZTC. Alignment between the Mendocino's Human Services Parapfoessional AS and Cerro Coso's Human Services Worker CoA was limited. Any OER creation planned by the group is for distinct local courses or courses with a C-ID that are not a part of the other cohort participants' pathways.

The ASCCC OERI recommends that the cohort participants continue to share any resources they adopt or adapt. There is no evidence for duplication of efforts amongst the proposed plans and no similarity between projects to warrant collaboration
