

Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) Acceleration Grant Collaboration Cohort Communication Studies Final Report

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INTRODUCTION

The Communication Studies Collaboration Cohort consisted of eighteen colleges. All are working on the same pathway, the Communication Studies Associate of Arts for Transfer (AA-T) degree. In addition, De Anza College is also working on a Certificate of Achievement and a local degree.

The ASCCC OERI collected course-level data from the colleges for each of the courses in the targeted pathways including current Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) status, adopted resources, and plans to convert a course to ZTC to identify overlap and areas of potential collaboration. As all colleges are working on establishing a Communication Studies AA-T pathway, the courses were grouped using the Communication Studies Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC) to identify commonalities.

COLLABORATION COHORT PURPOSE

The Academic Senate for California Community Colleges (ASCCC) Open Educational Resources Initiative (OERI) facilitated the work of the ZTC Acceleration Grant Communication Studies Collaboration Cohort. Although this process was introduced to prevent the duplication of effort, it also provides a means to ensure the awareness of available OER and other sustainable means of achieving ZTC status, share OER development plans, and identify opportunities for collaboration across colleges. At the conclusion of the cohort process, the OERI will provide a report to the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) that will document the work of the cohort, verify the absence of duplicative plans, and/or delineate how duplication will be prevented or minimized.

CONCLUSIONS

The Communication Studies Collaboration Cohort convened synchronously via Zoom on March 21, 2024. The ASCCC OERI presented the group with the results of the data collection process and asked for clarity where data were missing. In addition, the ASCCC OERI presented available OER for the cohort's consideration. Two follow-up meetings were held to discuss collaborative opportunities on April 29, 2024 and September 16, 2024. Despite the expressed interest in collaborative work, no collaborations are planned.

The ASCCC OERI recommends that the cohort participants share any resources that they are using to begin their efforts along with any frameworks for new OER creation that might be useful to other participants. Many of the C-ID aligned courses are currently ZTC and the majority of proposed projects focus on creating local adaptations of existing texts and/or creating supplemental materials. The ASCCC OERI recommends that colleges continue to share project progress for consideration as they complete their ZTC work. In addition, the ASCCC OERI recommends that any college with "plan pending" listed in the section above review the cohort plans and consider adoption before OER creation.
