Creative Commons (CC) is dedicated to helping build and sustain a thriving commons of shared knowledge and culture with the global standard of open licenses. Through workshops, consulting, and its [CC Certificate programs](#), CC helps people develop open licensing expertise and a deeper understanding of recommended open practices. CC also helps institutions develop and implement open licensing policies and practices for open education, open culture, open science, open data, open governance, and more.

The CC Certificate for Educators course provides an in-depth consideration of CC licenses, open practices, and the ethos of sharing in our global, digital commons. Upon

completion of the course, participants report becoming their institutions' contact for open licensing work; creating OER courses, workshops, and instructional resources; and successfully implementing open policies and grant requirements.

### **Introduction to African American Studies: An Anthology of Essays on Radical Black Thought, Intellect, and Culture**

[Introduction to African American Studies](#) is a groundbreaking Open Educational Resource (OER) that provides a comprehensive and interdisciplinary exploration of Black Studies. Drawing from Africana Studies, Black Feminism/Womanism, Black Psychology, and Cultural Studies, this anthology amplifies the voices of activists, scholars, artists, and clinicians working to challenge anti-Blackness and reclaim the intellectual traditions of Afrikan American communities. By centering Black life and knowledge, this collection examines abolitionist thought, cultural memory, and the transformative power of Black intellectual traditions. It addresses historical erasure, systemic oppression, and the ongoing struggle for justice, providing students with a critical foundation in the discipline. As the first freely available OER of its kind, this text ensures equitable access to Black Studies at a time when such scholarship is increasingly under attack. Engaging, thought-provoking, and deeply rooted in social justice, Introduction to African American Studies is an essential resource for anyone seeking to understand and contribute to the discourse on Black radical thought, intellect, and culture.

### **Ensuring Student Access to Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) Pathways**

California's investment in the ZTC Degree Program is intended to not merely increase the availability of ZTC course sections, but also to “ensure the development and implementation of the greatest number of degrees for the benefit of the greatest number of students” ([California Education Code Section 78052](#)). How do you maximize the number of students who truly complete a ZTC program? What's the minimum every college should be doing? Join us to consider approaches to achieving this goal – both aspirational and practical.

**Approaches to Integrating No-Cost Marking and XB12 (Instructional-Material-Cost) Coding into the Textbook Adoption Process**

In January of 2018, the requirement that California community colleges mark their no-cost course sections went into effect [[Senate Bill 1359 \(Block, 2016\)](#)]. In the summer of 2022, all colleges were to have implemented the initial iteration of XB12, a section level data element that was intended to identify course sections that achieved no-cost by using Open Educational Resources (OER). Effective summer 2024, XB12 was modified to more effectively capture course costs and to identify how a section became no-cost. Unfortunately, most colleges have not designated a person(s) responsible for ensuring the effective implementation of no-cost marking and XB12 coding. Further, obtaining the information for both often require faculty to provide the data in addition to reporting standard textbook adoption information. Can a process be created to ensure that accurate course material information is available to students at the time of registration and all required coding and marking happen in a streamlined fashion? Join us for a discussion of the challenges and an array of approaches to inform your integrated – or more integrated - approach to the collection of these data.
