


Evolution in teaching and learning.





Where We Are Now: Spring 2025

How We Got Here

Breakdown of Course Material Costs								
OER	59%

- Faculty-led, early adopters
- Leveraged multiple funding sources
- First ZTC pathway was mostly GE
- Prioritized funding for OER Librarian to coordinate initiative
- Board and Admin support
- OER Task Force \rightarrow OER Committee
- Culture of OER and innovative teaching practices
- Small college; awesome faculty

Building a Sustainable OER Program

- ZTC & LTC in the strategic plan
- OER Committee
- Admin and Board buy-in to support compensation
- AP/BP relating to OER use
- Always on the lookout for funding sources

- Connections to OER community
- Build OER into everything --PD/Flex, reports to the Board, etc.
- Culture of OER and cost-savings measures
- Dispel OER myths and fears

Things We Discovered We Needed...

- Somebody who can reformat badly formatted documents after remixing OERs
 - Consistent formatting theme or template
- Somebody who can check accessibility formatting
- Somebody to check all the licensing in faculty-created/adapted OER
- Peer reviewers and copy editors
- Somebody to create book covers (not a necessity, but nice to have)
- Some place to upload institution-created OER textbooks and somebody to manage those uploads
- An OER stipend structure that is adaptable to different project types
- Evolving OER PD, various options for levels of experience, and evening PD options


Advice for Others



- Offer plenty of PD -- adapt to the needs of the college/faculty as OER initiative progresses
 - \circ "What is OER?" \rightarrow "Publishing your own OER"
- OER initiative momentum will wax and wane over the years (employee turnover, pandemics, funding, etc.)
- Support staff also need support -remember to offer training and additional support to your OER support, as needed, especially as more grants or projects start
 - Project management takes *much* more time than many believe
- Adapt policies and procedures over time to best fit the needs of the college/faculty/ grants

Who We Are - MiraCosta College | Sociology Department

★ North County San Diego

- Our sociology department is deeply rooted in social justice, equity, and community empowerment.
- ★ We don't just teach about structural inequality—we work to make positive changes.
- In 2015, our department realized the textbook price tag was one more barrier we had to take down.







The Spark - The Problem: Textbooks Were Breaking Students

- Students skipping courses, struggling with outdated PDFs, hustling through school with stress instead of support.
- ★ We got organized, secured grant funds, and made a collective decision: go Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) across our program.
- Not just "free books"—we wanted high-quality, equity-centered learning experiences.







Our Model - What Made It Work at MiraCosta

- **★** Faculty-led, department-supported, institutionally sustained.
- Created a shared Canvas ZTC Shell, common materials, a public-facing ZTC Department Commitment Doc.
- ★ Customized OER with relevant pedagogy
 - Our version of ZTC was about liberation, not just logistics.







Collaboration = Culture - Build a Movement, not a Moment

Partnered with:

- ★ Accessibility team to get it right for all students.
- Library & Bookstore for attribution, organization, printing access.
- Research & Equity Offices to show the real impact-on real students.
- ★ We didn't do it alone. That's the point.







Results That Matter - Impact at MiraCosta

- ★ 110,000+ ZTC enrollments since 2017 = \$11M+ saved for students.
- ★ Sociology went from 21.6% ZTC in 2017 to 77% in 2024.
- Our model helped spark 10+ ZTC Pathway grants across campus.
- ★ CALGETC? Covered. CSU ADTs? Covered. UC pathways? Covered.
- ★ And the kicker? We kept the human in the work.







Lessons & Legacy - What We'd Tell Any College

What We'd Tell Any College

- Start with values Access, dignity, and joy in teaching & learning
- Make it collective. No lone heroes-build culture and community.
- **★** Recognize the labor. This work takes time, care, and heart.
- ★ We didn't just replace books-we reimagined what's possible.










The Foundation – Doing More with Less



- OER@DVC started with no/low resources, relying on faculty passion and small-scale initiatives.
- Early work in OER adoption, faculty recruitment, and advocacy laid the groundwork.
- Despite limited funding, these efforts demonstrated the need and impact of OER on student success.

Data as a Game Changer

- Used COVID funding to build a Tableau data dashboard to track ZTC and course success rates.
- Dashboard provided:
 - Hard evidence of student savings
 - Faculty adoption trends
 - Degree pathways overview
 - Disaggregated data to measure equity impact
 - Advocacy tool to secure additional funding



Scaling Through Collaboration



- Contra Costa Community College
 District (4CD) collaboration through
 the Districtwide OER Council (DOERC)
- 4CD Chancellor's Office support strengthened advocacy and funding opportunities.
- Led to securing a \$1M federal grant for OER expansion across the district.

Expanding Capacity, One Module at a Time

- OER@4CD: Asynchronous, self-paced training for faculty
- Topics include:
 - Finding, using, and creating OER
 - Creative Commons licensing
 - Equity and open pedagogy
 - Universal Design for Learning
- Designed to build shared understanding and sustainable practices

Measuring Our Impact: Takeaways

- \$8M+ in student savings by end of current grant cycle
- 206 faculty engaged, 694 course sections converted
- Ongoing projects continue expanding impact

Lessons Along the Way

- Start Small, Act Anyway
- Invest in Data Tracking
- Collaborate to Expand Impact
- Training Sustains Growth
- Scale thoughtfully



What's Next?

- Expanding ZTC pathways across more disciplines
- Further institutionalization of OER into curriculum planning
- Advocacy for sustained funding
 - Open invitations for collaboration and knowledge sharing
