• Discipline Surveys – Coming Soon •

The OERI is preparing to deploy discipline surveys throughout the term. Each survey will capture data from 4-6 disciplines and strive to obtain OER adoption data and OER needs. The first survey, OER 26F Discipline Survey Group I, will gather information from anthropology, child development, early childhood education, political science, psychology, and sociology faculty. Each survey will be shared with OERLs, distributed

via the existing discipline and OERI listservs, and posted on the OERI website. Who Prints the Free Books? Building a Sustainable Open Educational Resources (OER) Print Workflow

Open educational resources save students money, but they can create a practical problem that colleges don't always plan for: What happens when a student wants a printed copy? Faculty may be faced with requests they can't fulfill, and business offices may be asked to handle transactions without an established process. In this session, the Reedley College Business Office manager and an ESL faculty member explain how Reedley College solved this problem using *Marketplace*, both the setup phase (building the storefront, pricing, handling funds and fulfillment) and the classroom aspect (preparing materials, walking students through ordering, and what it's meant for access in an ESL context). We'll cover what worked, what we'd do differently, and the questions worth asking before your college implements an OER printing solution.

• **ASCCC OERI Seeking New Lead: Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Anti-Racism (IDEA)** •

The OERI is currently recruiting a faculty member to assume the role of the OERI IDEA Lead. The IDEA Lead must be able to work independently to set goals and identify ways to continue the OERI's IDEA work. As a member of the OERI leadership team, the IDEA Lead will meet regularly with the rest of the team to participate in planning, information sharing, and problem solving. While OER experience is desired, it is one of many factors that will be considered when reviewing applications. Below are additional details for the position.

ASCCC OERI IDEA Lead (20 – 40% reassigned time)

The ASCCC OERI IDEA Framework Lead is involved in implementing the [IDEA Framework](#) by informing discipline-based application of the framework through work with OERI Discipline Leads, providing guidance regarding the implementation of the Framework at the local level, and assisting faculty developing OER in incorporating IDEA principles into their projects. IDEA Lead activities also include increasing the availability of trained IDEA reviewers as well as developing and implementing a process for selecting and refining OER through application of the framework.

IDEA Lead Minimum Qualifications

- California community college faculty (full-time or part-time)
- Expertise or training in IDEA principles

IDEA Lead Desired Qualifications

- Experience with applying the OERI's IDEA Framework
- Knowledge and /or experience applying IDEA concepts
- Scholarly expertise in anti-racism
- Lived experience in marginalized communities
- OER author or adopter
